<p>Keep fit and healthy – try and exercise every day, even if it is inside your house (e.g. stretching, moving around your garden, yoga moves)</p> <p>Create a food planner for a week. Include meals you like and that are healthy. Think about snacks that you will have as well as main meals.</p>	<p>Sketch what you can see from your bedroom window.</p> <p>Research a famous artist that interests you – write a biography of their life, what type of art do they create? Recreate a piece of their artwork (if you can) and evaluate your work.</p>	<p>The history of Newport. Complete a project of Newport in the past. Decide what you will research. Examples: What was Newport like in the past? What is Newport famous for? (Romans, bridges, rivers etc) How has Newport changed over time? Have jobs in Newport changed over time? Have schools in Newport changed over time?</p>

<p>Keep a diary of things you've done each day – how are you feeling? What have you done? Eaten? Etc.</p> <p>Create a character portrait of character that would be the main character of an adventure story. Brainstorm ideas, what does your character look like? Special gifts or talents? Live? Draw an image of the character and label the features (role on the wall)</p> <p>Plan an adventure story with 5 clear steps to your story. (like we have done in class) Use key words and phrases, ambitious vocabulary you will use etc.</p> <p>Draft/write the 1st draft of your story. Make sure you use paragraphs, include a range of punctuation (! ? ; , - ' " “ ”) Follow your plan carefully. Have you used ambitious vocabulary?</p> <p>Edit, improve and publish your story.</p> <p><i>Keep your literacy skills 'on the boil' by reading, revising spellings, handwriting practise every day. Write and keep book reviews on books that you read.</i></p>	<p>Add and subtract whole numbers and decimals – create a list of 20 addition sums and 20 subtractions sums and solve using the column method. Check your answers using a calculator or family member.</p> <p>Challenge: Make sure there are 2 digits after the decimal point.</p> <p>Show an understanding of 2D and 3D shape. Draw the shapes and describe their properties using the correct vocabulary</p> <p>https://www.theschoolrun.com/what-are-the-names-of-2d-and-3d-shapes</p> <p><i>Keep your mental maths skills 'on the boil' by practising your times tables, number facts, counting skills and maths targets every day.</i></p>	<p>Bird watching activity – create a diary and tally chart of the birds you see in your garden each day. After a week use your tally chart to create a bar graph to show your results. Think carefully about the scale you use on your graph. Write a paragraph to interpret the graph.</p> <p>Can you design a leisure centre for our local area? Name? Draw a floor plan? Make a list of classes you would have. Make a list of what type employees you will need. What would you include in your leisure centre? Design a poster to advertise your leisure centre. Create a presentation to show case your leisure centre.</p> <p>You can present all of these pieces of work however you wish – use your hwb account to save any work that you do on the computer. You can print the work out when you are in school.</p>
