<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Handwashing and general hygiene • Cook a healthy meal • Keep a food, activity or feelings diary. • Play a game – it is ok to lose • Do daily exercise – try some yoga • Mindful colouring • Keep a food, activity or feelings diary. • Sing and dance to your favourite songs! Singing makes you feel great! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listen to different types of music and make and record your music with your family. • Draw what you can see out of your window • Make a sound story using body percussion and household items (e.g. represent rain, create a soundtrack/effects for a story) • Create and perform a puppet show for your family (using made puppets, toys etc) • Create a picture (art attack style) using household items – take a photograph! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Compare the toys you play with now and the toys you played with as a baby. • Learn the flags of different countries around the world. • Draw a map/plan of any room in your house or the whole house • Traffic count from the window (set a time, compare different times of the day, tally, bar graph etc) • Interview your family about their childhood (toys, school, technology, food etc) • Look at family photos and talk about the past

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Practice your welsh at home! Teach your family new welsh words that you know from Helpwr Heddiw in school. • Write a 'must read' list for your friends of the books you have read. • Write a simple book review (My favourite book is ... because...) • Keep a diary drawing and writing what you do/learn each day • Learn to read a new word everyday (see the list of keywords and make flashcards) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Set up a toy/book/cafe using household goods and role play paying for items and giving change using real money. • Continue to count forwards in steps of 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 – Count back in steps of 2,5 and 10. • Find 2D and 3D shapes around the home and sort them according to different properties. • Make collections of small household items and count these (make estimations first, group them in tens etc) • Order household items according to size, weight, length etc (use comparative language, use non-standard and standard measures) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Design an experiment to investigate which materials are absorbent and which are not. • Read food labels and sort foods into food groups, eg- protein, dairy, fat, sugar etc... • Learn about a famous scientist and what they are famous for.... • Group and sort different types of animals/insects/plants. • Explore different household items • What is it made of? • What properties does it have? (waterproof, shiny, transparent, absorbent etc) • Does it float/change shape etc?
